NEWCASTLE-upon-TYNE The Department of Archaeology has acquired
i) a flotation-sieving apparatus, ii) a computer terminal.

Corpus of Wallpaintings and Mosaics. Dr. R. Cormack reports that the first meeting of the Commission set up by the International Committee of the Association internationale des études byzantines for the purpose of producing the Corpus took place in Athens from 17-20 December 1982. Under the chairmanship of Manolis Chatzidakis the committee discussed the practical steps towards the establishment of an inventory of monuments - the period proposed is from the middle of the seventh century to the end of the fifteenth century and the region is that of the Byzantine Empire and other countries in which Byzantine art developed. Robin Cormack is one of five members of a sub-committee elected to do the groundwork - to establish a list of monuments, a standard form for describing their decoration and a vocabulary for referring to iconography etc. The sub-committee will meet to agree its recommendations in June 1983.

Libraries

BIRMINGHAM The Centre for Byzantine Studies Seminar Room now houses a collection of early printed Byzantine texts, on a long term loan from Oscott College.
