1 Foreword

The welcome extended to the first number of the BBBS, issued in January 1975, has encouraged the editors to publish its sequel a year later. It follows the general plan of its predecessor, providing information about recent publications, work in progress, University theses, conferences, seminars and public lectures in our field. It is not, however, entirely self-contained, and is intended to be used in conjunction with BBBS, 1. Thus, under "Work in Progress", only those projects are listed which were begun since January 1975. Readers wishing to obtain a more comprehensive picture of current research in Byzantine Studies in the United Kingdom are advised to consult Nos. 1 and 2 of the Bulletin together. Similarly, the list of publications comprises (with a few exceptions) only works published after 1973, and not listed in the first number.

The editors wish to record their gratitude to all those who, by responding to their requests for information, have helped to enlarge the scope and increase the usefulness of the <u>Bulletin</u>.
